## Congressional Candidates Seek LICA Support

The role of the **Long Island Contractors' Association (LICA)** as a strategic advocate of the taxpayer's biggest investment, our public infrastructure, was underscored as candidates running for the First and Fourth Congressional districts arrived in Hauppauge this week to meet with LICA's Board of Directors and present their positions on Long Island's infrastructure.

**New York State Senator Lee Zeldin (R-1st CD), Nassau County District Attorney Kathleen Rice (D-4th CD),** and former **Presiding Officer of the Nassau County Legislature Bruce Blakeman (R-4th CD)** offered insight regarding how they would advocate on behalf of Long Island's roads, bridges and highways if elected to Congress.

Zeldin is running against **George Demos** for the Republican nomination. The winner of that GOP primary will move on to challenge incumbent **Representative Tim Bishop**.

Along with Rice and Blakeman, **Nassau County Legislator Kevan Abrahams (D-4th CD)** and **Frank Scaturro (R-4th CD)** are vying for the Fourth congressional seat to fill the vacancy left by **Representative Carolyn McCarthy**. Those candidates have not indicated to LICA their position on infrastructure investment that would assist the region.

**LICA Chairman James Pratt, III**, stated, "While LICA will be deliberate in how, who and when to offer its support, these meetings reflect the fact that our region's infrastructure has become a powerful political litmus test for those seeking the support of potential constituents."
