Are Nassau Local Governments Shovel-Ready? Attend LICA's Breakfast this Thursday and Find Out



In a stunning disclosure, a LICA analysis reveals that most public works awarded on Long Island don't come from the State of New York but originate from our local governments. Our region's towns and counties comprise the first and second largest "customers" for infrastructure repair, restoration and construction, literally putting their money where their mouths are, leaving Albany a distant third in dollars committed to the infrastructure serving 2.7 million people.

This is no time for on-the-job training, and Tim will leave the starting blocks sprinting.”

LICA is also appreciative of New York State Transportation Commissioner Astrid Glynn and her senior staff. According to Herbst, “She has instituted a cooperative, supportive working relationship with transportation industry leaders. The Commissioner boldly issued a report that honestly details the transportation needs assessment of the state. That set the tone in earning our respect for her commitment to our causes.”

"State of Stimulus"

During the height of the campaign for the White House, Candidate Barack Obama proposed a \$60 billion "National Infrastructure Reinvestment Bank" as a method to jump-start a wobbling economy. This week, President Barack Obama signed what his idea morphed into, the \$787 billion "American Recovery and Reinvestment Act."

Depending on how items are defined determines whether the President reaches his \$60 billion goal for infrastructure projects, but of particular interest for our industry is that the total appropriation for the Highway Formula Funding is \$27.5 billion. Transit infrastructure is slated for \$7.65 billion. There is other significant funding for potable and waste water systems, railways, airport and building construction.

New York is designated to receive \$1.12 billion for highway funding. To view that figure in perspective, the current state budget is \$1.89 billion. Additionally, transit funds destined for New York are \$1.22 billion. The parity between monies for highway and transit are consistent with the state's practice of trying to keep these amounts nearly equal.

The state is now developing plans to designate these federal dollars for specific projects. LICA is working with our local officials to ensure that Long Island receives an equitable portion of the funds. A letter was dispatched to all Long Island state legislators urging them to fight for our region's traditional 23% allocation of funding. (Please [click here](#) to view letter.) LICA also assisted Congressman Tim Bishop in obtaining support from other officials so that this effort to obtain funds became truly bipartisan.

New York State Senator Chuck Fuschillo led a similar effort at our request.
